# 1. Computerspende Regensburg

The association “**Computerspende Regensburg**” collects computers and accessories from companies and private individuals on a donation basis and passes them on to people with low incomes or charitable organizations. They support longer use of computers by switching to an effective operating system (Linux) and thus help to avoid unnecessary new purchases. The association also promotes personal digital autonomy by using free, open-source software.

The non-profit hackspace "Binary Kitchen" promotes citizen science and education for technology enthusiasts. They offer a cozy platform for knowledge exchange, workshops, and labs. For example LED light art, open-source software, soldering courses, own smart home solutions and elements on self-built 3D printers and CNC milling machines are created.

The civil organizations “CampusAsyl” helps shaping a diverse society and promotes equal participation for people of all backgrounds through practical action and political positioning at the same time. CampusAsyl creates encounters, supports educational processes (e.g. language tandems, school child support) and promotes women (e.g. Mother School).

It supports foreign fellow citizens who are dependent on basic security benefits or corresponding social benefits, in overcoming hardship. With the "we code IT Academy" refugees work in close cooperation with IT experts from Nuremberg SMEs. Within the framework of weekly workshops, individual and group coaching sessions they go through an individual orientation and learning process.
